

## KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Is your child turning five on or before Dec. 31, 2018? If so, it's time to register for kindergarten. Kindergarten registration opens for the 2018-19 school year on Jan. 15, 2018 at 6:00PM. To register, simply complete the online registration form at *www.eips.ca/kindergarten*.

## KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION CHECK LIST:

- Determine your child's designated school
- Scan and upload all required documents: proof of name, residence, date of birth and citizenship.
- Additional documents to scan, if applicable include: Guardian Letter and Parental Custody Agreement if restrictions on access.
- Once the online registration is complete and submitted, a confirmation notice is sent to the given email address.

*NOTE:* The online registration form is available as of Jan.15, 2018—the paper version no longer exists. To help families prepare, Elk Island Public Schools has put together an online toolkit to make the transition as smooth as possible. The kit includes information on registration, important dates, programming options, what to expect,

Welcome back to everyone after what I hope was an enjoyable and relaxing Christmas Break. We are right back into the swing of things this week and are continuing our learning right where we left off.

In Language Arts we will continue our Writer's Workshops and work on becoming better writers. Our focus this month will be making sure our stories have a beginning, middle and end. We will also be continuing Literacy Centres and poetry.

In Mathematics we are finishing Unit 2: Numbers to 20, and then jumping right into Unit 5: Numbers to 100. Perfect timing for our 100<sup>th</sup> day of school coming up in February! WE are counting daily by ones, twos, fives and tens and I encourage families to practice this at home as well!

# Grade 2 News

Welcome back to school everyone! It looks as though to start off January will be very cold. Please ensure your child is dressed with lots of warm winter clothing.

Language Arts: Students will continue to write in their Friday journals to parents. Please read what you have written to your child. This journal is a great way to have

some written communication with your child. They really love "talking" with you in this form.



Spelling words are stapled in agendas on Monday. This word list is to stay at home

and be studied over the course of the week. I have also sent home a tic-tac-toe spelling homework sheet that will be due each Thursday. The test is given on Fridays (Thursdays if no school Friday). Your child's test may be modified so he/she will have the most success. If you see an "M" at the top of the page, your child is sitting with me or Mrs. Desabrais to do the test with three different words for the child to choose as the correct spelling before writing it down.

Winter writing will continue this month with transitional words such as first, next, then and finally. Also descriptive writing using the five senses about winter.

Math: Students may use a variety of manipulatives to help them in our new unit called "Adding and Subtracting to 18". Please practice adding numbers up to 9+9=18 and subtracting numbers up to 18-9=9. If requested, please allow your child to use a number line and/or other objects as counters to do this math.

Science: "Exploration of Liquids" is the unit we will begin this month. Students learn how liquids flow, take the shape of containers they are in, can change into solid or gas, have surface tension, are absorbent, and are always moving. They will engage in many experiments.

Social: The students are continuing their journey to Meteghan, Nova Scotia to experience life in the Maritimes. Lobster fishing and festivals are some of the fun they will enjoy while learning about the traditions, geography and animals of Meteghan.

# Grade 4 News



✓ <u>Language Arts:</u> This month, we will continue working on our Words Their Way sorting based spelling program. We will also begin small group novel studies. We will concentrate on summarizing, making inferences and predictions, as well as analyzing the author's purpose.

- ✓ <u>Math</u>: We are continuing our unit on multiplying and dividing unit, however we will shift our focus from multiplying to dividing. I continue to encourage all students to practice these basic facts on a regular basis!
- ✓ <u>Science</u>: We began our Light and Shadow unit this month. Students will learn about light by studying the effects of light on things within their environment. They learn about light sources, materials that light can pass through and what happens when a material blocks or changes the path of light. They discover that mirrors, prisms and a variety of other materials can affect that path by reflecting and refracting light and splitting it into colors.
- ✓ <u>Social:</u> Through projects and storytelling, we will begin looking at which First Nations live Alberta, why First Nations are important to Alberta's identity, and the impact of the residential school system.



#### **Changes Coming to Kindergarten Programming**

Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) is changing its kindergarten program. Starting in the 2018-19 school year, all elementary schools will offer one kindergarten option, alternating full-day programming. Children will attend two full-days a week and occasionally, three days a week to meet the required 475 instructional hours—the quality and hours of education will remain the same. Already, more than half of EIPS' elementary schools offer the alternating full-day kindergarten, which have all seen positive results around preparing students for successful transitions to Grade 1.

The decision to standardize kindergarten programming is based on available funding to sustain the noon-hour bus service. The alternating full-day program allows the Division to keep education dollars in the classroom rather than subsidizing transportation.

#### **Inclement Weather**

With the winter season well underway, we want to remind parents to dress children appropriately for the weather when getting ready for school or the bus. The weather often changes unexpectedly throughout the day, so please select suitable outerwear and ensure your child is prepared for changing conditions.

If inclement weather conditions occur, Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) will advise parents of any bus cancellations using various communications tools including: automated-telephone messages, alerts posted on *www.eips.ca* and school websites, Twitter, Facebook, local radio stations, and on Versatrans My Stop.

Decisions regarding bus cancellations are guided by EIPS administrative procedures that states: "school bus service may be suspended when...Environment Canada reports a temperature of -40 C." Other reasons for suspending or delaying school bus services include adverse weather and poor road conditions.

When school bus services are suspended, schools will remain open to students. EIPS believes parents have the right and responsibility to make choices for their children based on their beliefs and perceptions of safety during times of inclement weather.

#### **Request To Attend A Non-Designated School**

Effective for the 2018-19 school year, Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) is changing the way in which students apply to attend a non-designated school. From March 1 to 15, 2018, parents of all EIPS students are being asked to pre-enrol their children online and indicate whether their child will be attending their designated school or if they wish to register at a different school. Acceptance at a non-designated school is based on available space–families will be advised of the outcome by April 13, 2018. Because of high enrolment numbers, some schools won't be accepting any non-designated students. Schools with closed boundaries will be identified prior to the pre-enrolment process.

Please note that should you request a non-designated school for your child and need busing, there are fees associated with this choice. Visit Transportation Services for more information.

As part of the pre-enrolment process, parents are also asked to check and update phone numbers, email addresses, mailing address and other important data – doing so will both make sure that the Division has the most current information available and eliminate the need to fill in the paper Correction Form that has traditionally been sent home every fall. Better yet, families will be able to go online and update their child's data throughout the year as circumstances change.

#### Pay School Fees Online Easily Using PowerSchool

School fee information for the 2017-18 school year is expected to be posted on the PowerSchool Parent Portal by early October. All fees are due within 30 days of being posted. To access your fee information, simply log in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal and go to "Student Fees." There you can view your fees and pay them online using Visa, MasterCard or INTERAC Online—when available from your financial institution.

Don't forget to log in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal regularly throughout the year. Fees are often added to your child's account to cover the cost of various school activities such as field trips, class projects, athletic-team fees and more.
