#### April 22 Board Meeting

Approved budget allocations to schools and Departments

The board has allocated \$500,000 to addressing the learning gap and \$500,000 to address the social emotional needs of our students due the pandemic. These funds will not come from the school budgets. This will be additional money for school administration to decide how to best use the dollars within their schools. Approved administrative fees including space rentals and transportation fees. Transportation fees: Eligible students - \$100 In eligible students - \$325

Supplement bus fee - \$100

2. School Budget - Overall, the budget amounts for 21-22 are very similar to the 20-21 Budget. Bruderheim does have less students for the upcoming year, which created a small drop in funding for the upcoming year. The enrollment currently expected for the fall is 109 students. Teaching assignments and class configurations are tentatively planned at this time and will be finalized and announced in August, when the school office reopens. Enrolment can change over the summer and classroom composition plans and teaching assignments may change.
